##### 6.3.1 Curriculum Development

Institution has limited opportunity for curriculum development as it is an affiliated college. Faculty who are members of the BOS take active part in framing relevant and updated syllabi to cater to the needs of the students.

##### 6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

IQAC prepares the academic calendar of events for the year. Tests, assignments, seminars, and group discussion are arranged to help students in sharing knowledge. Study tours and field visits are encouraged to improve the field experience. Special lecturers and demonstrations are arranged to impart additional knowledge. Remedial teaching is conducted to help slow learners. Faculty are always available to the students for discussion and guidance.

##### 6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Theory and practical examinations are conducted as per the university guidelines. However, for internal assessment purpose tests, seminars, assignments, and project work are conducted. Apart from the attendance, participation in co-curricular activities and overall behaviour of students are also considered.

#### 6.3.4 Research and Development

The research cell of the institute motivates faculty and students to take up research projects. It arranges lectures by eminent scientists and scholars about recent developments and innovations. The research cell motivates the teachers to apply for research projects. As a result most of the faculty have completed their doctorates and many others, their minor research projects.

#### 6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

- The college has the richest library in the district with adequate books and the journals.
  - Inlib.net subscription has provided access to thousands of e-books and e-journals.
  - Reading space is provided to students and faculty in the library.
  - Computers with internet connections are providing free browsing facility to all.
  - There are seven smart boards used by all the departments as and when needed.
  - A well equipped audiovisual room is used for programs and presentations.
  - The science laboratories are upgraded with all the modern instruments like spectrometers, telescope, Microscope, Micro image projecting system (MIPS), Cold-Centrifuge etc. Department of chemistry has installed the electrochemical working station which helps to conduct many experiments.
  - Dept of English has a well equipped language lab.
- In the vast campus of 38 acres there are two hostels, a Canteen, a Gym-centre, Play

#### 6.3.6 Human Resource Management

Students are the major human resource and the institute strives for their all-round development through NCC, NSS, Rover's club, Red-cross, Gymkhana and cultural activities. Through these units students are motivated to involve themselves in different types of activities of social responsibility. Teaching staff are encouraged to update their knowledge by attending refresher courses, orientation courses, conference, workshops and symposia. Parents and alumni are taken to trust and suggestions are sought from them through meetings.

#### 6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

Recruitment of teaching and non teaching staff is strictly done as per the rules laid down by the government /UGC by the management on permission. Honorary staff recruitment is done at the institutional level as per necessity.

#### 6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration

Industrial tours are conducted every year for the science students to expose them to the modern instruments and technology. The post graduate students of chemistry collaborate with the industries like Solaris - chemicals, UB group of distilleries Goa and local industries like M.N Chemicals etc for the project work. The college has MOU with Karnataka Forest Department, High-Tec diagnostics, Samana Vedike Mysore.

### 6.3.9 Admission of Students

A printed copy of the college prospectus is provided to every student seeking admission, which contains all the details about the institution. A committee appointed by the principal looks into the admission of the students every year. At the time of admission it is mandatory for the parents to accompany their ward. The committee counsels the students to select the optional subject according to their aptitude and inclination.
